Some spaces in the Museum are more sensory friendly than others. Use this map to help guide your visit and find places that tend to be less crowded, noisy, or bright.

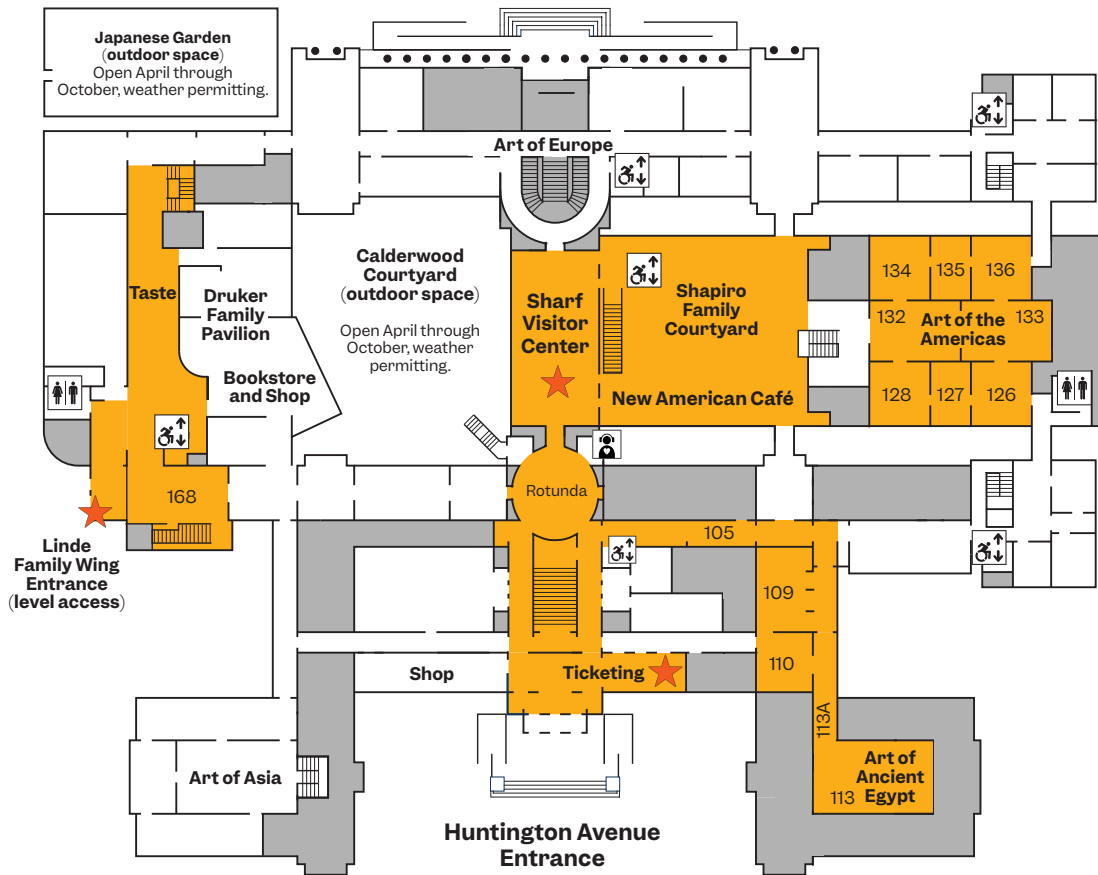
